SCORING REQUIREMENTS FOR BASIC RECRUIT AND INSTRUCTOR STUDENTS

Handgun Daylight	48 round course of fire.	Two qualifying scores of 39 or higher, back to back. Three out of six attempts. The scoring area will be any hit that is inside or touches the exterior scoring. For example, 4 and 5 zone of the B-21E target.
Handgun Night	36 round course of fire.	One qualifying score of 29 or higher. One out of two attempts. The scoring area shall be any hit that is inside or touches the exterior scoring line. For example, 4 and 5 zone of the B-21E target.
Shotgun Daylight	8 round course of fire	One qualifying score of 58 if using "00" buckshot, or "7" if using rifled slugs. One out of two attempts. The scoring area shall be any hit that is inside or touches the exterior scoring line. For example, 4 and 5 zone of the B-21E target.
Rifle/Carbine	20 round course of fire	One qualifying score of 16 or higher. One out of two attempts. The scoring area shall be any hit that is inside or touches the exterior scoring line. For example, 4 and 5 zone of the B-29 reduced police silhouette.

INSTRUCTOR TO STUDENT RATIO

Pursuant to Rule 11B-35.0021, F.A.C., the rangemaster shall be a Commission-certified firearms instructor and shall not be included as an instructor to comply with the instructor to student ratio requirements. For instruction of the CMS Criminal Justice Firearms Course or CMS Firearms Instructor Course there shall be no more than six students actively engaged on a firearms range for each Commission-certified firearms instructor. Actively engaged is defined as "a student on the firing range handling a weapon." Discretionary course of fire shall be conducted with a one-to-one instructor to student ratio. One rangemaster shall supervise all range activity while training is actively engaged.

BASIC RECRUIT STUDENT PROFICIENCY SKILLS REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to Rule 11B-35.0024, F.A.C., a basic recruit student shall demonstrate the required Firearms High-Liability Proficiency Skills, using the B-21E Target or equivalent, at 80% or higher using a handgun (revolver or semi-automatic pistol for both daylight and night) and a long gun (shotgun or semiautomatic rifle/carbine). Basic recruit students shall use the B-21E Target or equivalent for handgun and shotgun qualification, and a reduced target for the rifle/carbine (Q-RD, Q-TCRD2, or B-29 reduced police silhouette).

INSTRUCTOR STUDENT PROFICIENCY SKILLS REQUIREMENTS

An instructor student shall complete the CMS Firearms Instructor Course pursuant to Rule 11B-20.0014, F.A.C., to instruct the CMS Criminal Justice Firearms Course in the CMS Firearms Instructor Course. A firearms instructor student shall demonstrate the required Firearms High-Liability Proficiency Skills, at 80% or higher using a handgun (revolver or semi-automatic pistol) for daylight and night, and a long gun (shotgun or semiautomatic rifle/carbine) for all proficiency skills, with the results recorded on the required CJSTC-4 CMS form. The B-21E target or equivalent shall be used for handgun and shotgun qualifications and a reduced target for the rifle/carbine (Q-RD, Q-TCRD2, or B-29 reduced police silhouette). Scoring of the targets shall be the same as for the Basic Recruit Training Program. There is no remediation for instructor students.

An instructor student shall qualify on the first day of class with a handgun (revolver or semi-automatic pistol) and a long gun (shotgun or semiautomatic rifle/carbine) on the Commission's Basic Recruit Training Firearms Course of Fire with proficiency rating of 80% or higher.

RE-TEST

Basic Recruit Student. A basic recruit shall be given the opportunity for one additional attempt at the required demonstration of high-liability proficiency skill(s) or one re-examination of required cognitive knowledge in the high-liability topic. A basic recruit student who has failed to successfully demonstrate the cognitive knowledge or the required high-liability demonstration after a second attempt shall be deemed to have failed the high-liability course.

Instructor Student. An instructor student shall successfully demonstrate cognitive knowledge and proficiency skill(s) during the initial qualification. If he or she fails to successfully demonstrate the cognitive knowledge or high-liability proficiency skill(s) during the first attempt, he or she shall be deemed to have failed the high-liability instructor course.
